SERVICES

The UWSA provides many services to both students and community members. Below is a summary of the developments of our services.

Health Plan: EXEC worked with the University of Winnipeg to find an acceptable alternative insurance provider for International Students. Looking into better opt-out methods for sponsored First Nation students.

Daycare: No updates at this time.

Academic Advocacy: Working with the faculty and staff here at the University, the VPSA has been representing students on the Senate Student Appeals Committee and, when requested, at the Senate Academic Misconduct Committee. Students have approached the UWSA for advocacy surrounding plagiarism and cheating allegations, grade appeals, and concerns surrounding instructors. The VPSA also advocates for students applying for retroactive withdrawals, incomplete coursework, and deferred exams. With assistance from the Special Projects Manager and Communications Manager, the VPSA has been developing a Students' Guide to Academic Misconduct Procedures.

Service Centres: VPEA Zee has been working with the communications manager and rainbow lounge coordinator regarding the Rainbow Lounge's new branding. All staff are hired and working on recruitment and organizing for the year.

U-Pass: Our retail manager has increased the cost of replacement cards generate revenue at our info booth, and to also incentivize from losing multiple cards.

Bike Lab: Continuing to operate on the scheduled Monday, Fab Lab is currently not operating until our staff can fill the position with the appropriate training.

Retail Locations: We have increased our doughnut order.

Food Bank: Our foodbank coordinator was on leave for a month, and have since returned. During that time, hours were offered to our WTSC service coordinator.

Refugee/Newcomer/People Without Status Bridging Program: VPEA Zee has been meeting with Jan Stewart, Andrea McClusky, and David Atem regarding the creation of the bridging program

Positive Space: EXEC have met regarding changes to positive space.

Prairies RISE: PRES, VPEA, VPIA have been involved in planning the 2019 Prairies RISE.

'Indigenization': PRES attended first meeting at UWinnipeg's Indigenous Advisory Circle.

mediaINDIGENA Live Podcast: We are proud to organize and support mediaINDIGENA's live podcast event on October 18, 2018. The event will take place at 7:00 pm (Doors open at 6:30 pm) at Eckhardt-Gramatté Hall and it is free for all students. Podcast features: Rick Harp (Host and Producer), Dr. Kim TallBear (Associate Professor, faculty of Native Studies at UAlberta), Tim Fontaine (Editor-in-Grand Chief, Walking Eagle News).

Gender Based Violence Events: VPEA Zee and VPSA Jade DeFehr have been working with the Events Manager and WTSC Coordinator to plan a series of events in late October and early November around gender based violence. We will be screening Slut or Nut: Diary of a Rape Trial, hosting a panel, holding a 'conversation café', and looking into booking a performance of a Sarasvati monologue.

SOLIDARITY

Migrante/Anakbayan: VPEA Zee and VPIA Brenden have been meeting with Migrante Manitoba to start a chapter of Anakbayan in Winnipeg. Anakbayan is a comprehensive organization for Filipino youth. They advocate for jobs, land reform, and political issues. VPEA Zee has been helping plan the Murupuro Event.
