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8.e Kinesiology and Applied Health Directorship By-law Amendments

Whereas the Faculty of Kinesiology and Applied Health has existed since 2012;

Whereas the Faculty of Kinesiology and Applied Health oversees the Departments of Kinesiology and Applied Health, as well as the Department of Athletics (Wesmen), and the Department of Recreation Services (Axworthy Health & RecPlex, Duckworth Centre);

Whereas the UWSA Recreation and Athletics Director does not reflect the current academic needs of the Faculty of Kinesiology and Applied Health;

Whereas the Faculty of Kinesiology and Applied Health remains the only faculty to be unrepresented on the UWSA Board of Directors;

Be it resolved that the Recreation and Athletics Director be renamed to "Kinesiology and Applied Health Director," and

Be it further resolved that By-Law 4.1 be amended to read "Kinesiology and Applied Health Director,"

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Be it further resolved that By-law 4.6 (Qualification of Directors for Election and Holding Office) be amended to include:

- i. The Kinesiology and Applied Health Director shall be a student enrolled in one of the following programs:
 - a) Bachelor of Physical and Health Education
 - b) Bachelor of Kinesiology – Sport Coaching
 - c) Bachelor of Kinesiology – General
 - d) Bachelor of Science – Exercise Science
 - e) Bachelor of Science – Athletic Therapy”

Be it further resolved that By-law 6.16 (Duties of the Recreation and Athletics Director) be amended as follows:

6.16 Duties of the Kinesiology and Applied Health Director

- i. The ***Kinesiology and Applied Health Director***, while at all times keeping in mind the general welfare of the UWSA and all of its Members, shall ensure that the interests particular to Kinesiology and Applied Health students are represented at the

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Board of Directors. The Kinesiology and Applied Health Director shall act as spokesperson for these issues.

- ii. The Kinesiology and Applied Health Director shall assist the UWSA executive in corresponding with the University, government, and community on academic matters relevant to Kinesiology and Applied Health students.
- iii. The Kinesiology and Applied Health Director shall act as liaison with any Kinesiology and Applied Health Students' groups on campus
- iv. The Kinesiology and Applied Health Director shall act as liaison with Recreation Services administrators in order to represent the views of students and the UWSA, and will serve on any Duckworth Centre and/or Axworthy Health and RecPlex committees on behalf of the UWSA.
- v. The Kinesiology and Applied Health Director will strive to promote and achieve equity in the distribution of resources among teams and events, with special attention to groups such as, but not

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limited to, women, racialized students, and students with disabilities.

- vi. The Kinesiology and Applied Health Director shall perform other duties that the Board of Directors determines from time to time by motion or By-Law.

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8.f Dissolution of Directorships Proposal

Whereas the UWSA Board of Directors has seen many adjustments to Directorships to reflect the changing needs of the University of Winnipeg campus community, including the addition of the Urban and Inner-City Campus Director, the Menno Simons College Director, and the proposal of the Racialized Students' Director;

Whereas several UWSA Directorships have become unnecessary due to shifting portfolios of the UWSA Executive: including the creation of the Vice-President External Affairs position to liaise with community organizations, and the expansion of the Vice-President Student Affairs position to conduct both academic and non-academic advocacy, including student services and housing issues;

Be it resolved that the following Directorships be discontinued from the UWSA Board of Directors:

- 1) Community Liaison Director
- 2) Part-Time/Mature Students' Director
- 3) Student Living Director

Be it further resolved that any occurrence of any Directorship in either the By-Laws or Policies of the be

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removed from the By-Laws and Policies of the organization.

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8.g Equitable Executive Proposal

Whereas the University of Winnipeg Student's Association (UWSA)'s values include anti-oppressive leadership, authentic representation and continual reflection;

Whereas the UWSA's vision is to create a democratic post-secondary system;

Whereas having equitable roles will create more equal representation;

Be it Resolved that the UWSA Bylaws and Policy Committee explore new bylaws and policies surrounding executive roles and titles, to be presented at the October SGM;

Be it Further Resolved that the UWSA create four equitable executive positions.
