



The therapists can assess and treat any bone, muscle, ligament, tendon or joint related injury. All services provided by our therapists are covered by a number of insurance plans, including Green Shield and Manitoba Blue Cross. The clinic is open to all students, staff, faculty as well as the general community. Our therapists look forward to helping get you back to your activities injury free!

The UWinnipeg Undergraduate Exchange Program is a fantastic opportunity for our students to study abroad for a term or two at one of our partner universities, while retaining their UWinnipeg student status.

The goals of writing tutoring are to facilitate the processes that lead to better writers, helping all students become better at identifying problem spots in their own writing and becoming better readers of their prose. Instead, we will work with you to help you learn about writing, discover areas in which your writing can improve, and learn about how to resolve issues in your writing.



You do not have to be an English major to join, students of all majors and levels are more than welcome!


FESA is an amazing and dynamic hub that celebrates the passion and curiosity of students in the realms of finance and economics.




